What can Trading Standards Do?

- Most scams are originate from outside of the UK
- Consumer Education and Advice
- Contact Banks
- Financial Ombudsman
- Install Call blockers
- Other resources
- Referrals to other agencies

What is Doorstep Crime?



Offenders cold-calling consumers mostly older/vulnerable adults

Offering property repairs; roofing, tarmac, block paving, gardening

Selling products; fish, furniture, mobility aids, security systems

Charge extortionate prices, take large deposits, charging for extra

~~work~~ Deliberately damaging property to obtain work

Payment in cash, no paperwork

Drive consumers to the bank

Links to distraction burglaries

Warning Signs



Knocking on the door without an appointment

Starting work immediately, finding extra work, poor workmanship

Demanding cash, aggressive behaviour

No paperwork or cancellation rights

Unsolicited phone call offering a

Requesting payment to a random name, not the trader themselves

Repeat visits

What can Trading Standards Do?

- Trader Disruption
- Banking Protocol
- DSC Partnership with Police
- Prevent money being handed over/
money refunded
- Sharing of Intelligence
- Ring Door Bells
- Successful Prosecutions
