The Devon Countryside Access Forum (DCAF) is a local access forum under the Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000 (CRoW Act). Its statutory remit is to give independent advice “as to the improvement of public access to land in the area for the purposes of open-air recreation and the enjoyment of the area...” Section 94(4) of the Act specifies bodies to whom the Forum has a statutory function to give advice, and this includes the Forestry Commission.

The DCAF currently has seventeen members, appointed by Devon County Council, who represent the interests of landowners/managers, access users and other relevant areas of expertise such as conservation and tourism.

In line with previous advice, the Devon Countryside Access Forum wishes to make the following comments. This response will be on the agenda for formal approval at the next meeting on 22 January.

The Devon Countryside Access Forum recognises the necessity of felling and thinning for effective woodland management. The felling area outlined on the map is partly access land (Whilborough Common) and is crossed by a footpath, Kingskerswell

footpath 13. Members of the public may well explore the common as well as using the public right of way.

It would be helpful if you could confirm what measures are in place to ensure the safety of the public during felling operations and whether a direction will be sought to prohibit access during this period.

The Forum would welcome clarification on how and when details about felling will be communicated to the public. It would be beneficial for Kingskerwell Parish Council and local access organisations, such as the South Devon Group of the Ramblers, to know the timing of works so that potential access users could be informed through appropriate channels, in addition to works notices on site.
