- (a) approving a consultation take place on a proposal to extend the age range of St Giles-on-the-Heath Primary School from 4-11 to 2-11 with effect from September 2024.
- (b) if consultation at (a) is agreed, proceeding straight to a four week formal representation period providing there are no materially significant objections received to the consultation.

In the event that such objections are received to the consultation, that the decision to move to the formal representation period be determined by Cabinet Member decision.

(c) Upon completion of (a) and (b) above, approval of the proposal to extend the age range of St Giles-on-the-Heath Primary School from 4-11 to 2-11 from September 2024, providing no materially significant objections are received to the formal representation period.

In the event that such objections are received to the formal representation period, that the decision to approve the proposal be determined by Cabinet Member decision.

## Summary of Reason(s) for Decision Taken

In accordance with the Department for Education's School Organisation Statutory guidance and legislation, changes to the age range of 1 year or more for Community schools requires a four stage statutory process of consultation, representation, decision by the Local Authority and implementation.

St Giles-on-the-Heath Primary is a Community Primary School maintained by Devon County Council. The school caters for children aged 4-11.

The proposal is to lower the age range from 4-11 to 2-11 from September 2024.

There is an existing Governor run Pre-School, situated on the grounds of St Giles-on-the-Heath Primary School which currently offers places to 2, 3 and 4 year olds.

This proposal is concerned with the Pre-school becoming part of the school rather than operating as an extended service. There will be no change in relation to the number of early years places currently offered and no change to the school's published admission number. If the proposal is approved, the main difference is that the Pre-school will become a maintained Nursery Class, organised as a Foundation Stage Unit (Nursery and Reception class integrated). Early Years staff will be employed directly by the school and children currently in the Pre-school will be registered on the school roll, if the proposal is approved.

Parents will still need to make a separate application to Devon County Council for a place in the Reception class.

Devon's Early Years and Childcare Service is supportive of this proposal and have advised the school on staffing requirements and meeting the early years foundation stage qualification and ratio requirements.

Devon's Schools Finance Service have reviewed the school's budget plan and other supporting documentation and are also supportive of this proposal.

Planning consent is not required.

It is also confirmed that no capital is required from the Local Authority, the proposal will not affect the school's net capacity or published admission number and will not put pressure on existing classroom space.

The proposal is in line with the policies and procedures contained within the Education Infrastructure Plan 2016-2033 (revised) and the statutory responsibilities relating to the strategic planning of pupil places and school organisation procedures.

A consultation and a formal representation period will take place and will be published on DCC's Have Your Say website as well as the school website. The consultation and formal representation stage will be widely circulated to parents/carers, staff and governors of the school, as well as County Councillors, District Councillors, MP, Union representatives, all schools, local Early Years Providers, Equality groups, Parish Council amongst others in accordance with Cabinet Office consultation principles and in line with School Organisation legislation.
