Definitive Map Review 2011- 2012 Parish of Gulworthy

Report of the Head of Highways and Traffic Management

Recommendation: It is recommended that it be noted that the Definitive Map Review has been completed in the parish of Gulworthy and no modifications are required.

1. Summary

The report examines the Definitive Map Review in the parish of Gulworthy in the West Devon Borough.

2. Background

Gulworthy parish was created in 1987 from the parish of Tavistock Hamlets. The original survey, under s. 27 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949, revealed six footpaths in the modern Gulworthy parish area, which were recorded on the Definitive Map and Statement, Tavistock Rural District with the relevant date of 1 May 1958.

The review of the Definitive Map, under s. 33 of the 1949 Act, which commenced in the 1970s, but was never completed, produced no proposals for change to the map in the parish.

The Limited Special Review of Roads Used as Public Paths (RUPPS), also carried out in the 1970s, did not affect this parish.

3. Review

The current Review began in June 2011 with a public meeting held in the Parish Hall. Public consultation was carried out and the review was advertised in the parish and in the Tavistock Times.
