- 4. While there were a number of other issues raised by Independent Members as part of their observations there were no reports of any specific actions or behaviours that might be felt to have resulted in a potential breach of the Code or warranted further action.
- 5. Conversely, a Member praised the application of improved systems put in place to ensure compliance with procedures, ensure the involvement of all relevant persons and avoid a recurrence of problems experienced at a previous meeting of the same Committee.
- 6. Specific observations by Independent Members were that:
  - skillful, firm Chairmanship assisted the conduct of the meeting;
  - Members demonstrated a clear understanding of and the impact of decisions upon the public and interested parties;
  - the audibility of speakers/acoustics, particularly in the Council Chamber, continues to be a problem [The purchase of a replacement system is being explored]
  - Members need to be careful not to give the impression or acting in such as way as to give
    the impression they may not be giving their fullest attention to debates and, similarly, they
    avoid participating in 'separate conversations' during debates which are not only
    discourteous to speakers but may reflect poorly on the conduct of the meeting, particularly
    when meetings are webcast.
- 7. It is acknowledged that seating arrangements for Independent Members may not always be conducive to their task and where possible this will be rectified.
- 8. This Report has no specific equality, sustainability, legal or public health implications that are not already covered by or subsumed within the detailed policies or practices referred to therein.
