1. Definitions

In this scheme:

“the Charity” means the charity created by clause 2 of this scheme.

“the Act” means the Reverter of Sites Act 1987

“the Area of Benefit” means the town of Okehampton

“the Commission” means the Charity Commission of England and Wales”.

“the Property” means the proceeds of sale of the land and building described in the schedule to this scheme.

“Educational Institutions” means any school, college or Further Education Corporation, whether voluntary controlled or otherwise, conducted in accordance with the requirements of the Education Acts

ADMINISTRATION

2. Administration

The Property is to be administered in accordance with this scheme. This scheme replaces the former trusts of the Property.

3. Name of the charity

The name of the Charity is The Throwleigh Centre.

4. Extinguishment of Rights and Claims

The rights and claims of any revertees as provided for under the Act are statute barred by virtue of the Act of Reverter having taken place before 17th August 1975 (12 years before the Act came into force) and the rights of the revertees cannot be revived

OBJECT

5. Object of the charity.

The object of the charity is to advance the education of young people under the age of 25 years and resident in Okehampton, or who have at any time attended a school in the Area of Benefit, through the provision of grants or items to Educational Institutions or individuals in need of such assistance and for the acquisition of land/buildings for the provision of an Educational Institution in the Area of Benefit

POWERS OF THE TRUSTEE

6. Powers of the trustee

In addition to any other powers which they have, the trustees may exercise the following powers in furtherance of the objects of the charity:

- (1) Power to make rules and regulations consistent with this scheme for the management of the charity.
- (2) Power to sell, lease or otherwise dispose of all or any part of the charity's property. (The trustee must comply with the restrictions on disposal imposed by section 117 of the Charities Act 2011, unless the sale, lease or disposal is excepted from these restrictions by section 117 (3) or section 117 (4) of that Act). Any proceeds of sale are permanent endowment and must be treated accordingly.

TRUSTEES

7. Trustee

Devon County Council is appointed trustee of the charity.

CHARITY PROPERTY

8. Use of income

- (1) The trustees must first apply:
 - (a) the charity's income; and
 - (b) if the trustees think fit, expendable endowmentin meeting the proper costs of administering the charity and of managing its property.
- (2) After payment of these costs, the trustees must apply the remaining income in furthering the object of the charity.
- (3) The trustees may also apply for the object of the charity:
 - (a) expendable endowment; and
 - (b) permanent endowment, but only on such terms as the Commission may approve by order in advance.

GENERAL PROVISION

9. Questions relating to the Scheme

The Commissioners may decide any question put to them concerning:

- (1) the interpretation of this scheme; or
- (2) the propriety or validity of anything done or intended to be done under it.
