The Chair had decided that, at the request of Councillors Sellis, the Committee should consider these items as a matter of urgency due to concerns raised.

Vigo Mews/Parkwood Road junction, Tavistock

Councillor Sellis stated that double yellow lines were needed sooner rather than later at the junction of Vigo Mews/Parkwood Road, Tavistock to allow residents safe access to and egress from their properties.

The Chief Officer for Highways, Infrastructure Development and Waste confirmed that this would be included in the work programme as a priority for next year and advertised next Spring with the intention of reporting any objections received to the July 2019 Committee meeting.

Zebra Crossing at Dousland Road, Yelverton

The Chair reported that following the resurfacing of Dousland Road, the zebra crossing markings had not been replaced and the zigzag markings were only partially visible. The Chief Officer for Highways, Infrastructure Development and Waste undertook to investigate further.

* 26 Annual Local Waiting Restriction Programme

Mr Mason attended the meeting under the Council's Public Participation Scheme and spoke against the proposal for parking restrictions on Grenville Drive, Tavistock, set out in paragraph 5 to the Report (HIW/18/53).

The Committee considered the Report of the Chief Officer for Highways, Infrastructure Development and Waste (HIW/18/53) on the Annual Local Waiting Restriction Programme for each HATOC area for the funding and delivery of waiting restriction schemes, to include minor aids to movement improvements such as drop crossing, footway improvements and bollards.

The Cabinet had allocated an amount of £100,000 countywide from the On-Street Parking Account to this process in 2018/19 which equated to £12,500 to each HATOC area.

The Chief Officer clarified that the proposal set out in paragraph 5 of the Report (HIW/18/53) would be on an experimental basis and that, acknowledging the representations made, survey work would be undertaken at the location and a further report made to a future meeting of this Committee.

Please note that the following recommendations are subject to consideration and determination by the Committee before taking effect.

Recommendation: It is recommended that:

- (a) work on the annual waiting restrictions programme process for 2018/2019 is noted;
- (b) the recommendation contained in Section 4 to this report is agreed.

1. Background

Proposals for the West Devon HATOC Annual Waiting Restriction Review for 2018 were presented to this Committee on 16 July 2018.

2. Proposal

Agreed proposals have since been advertised with significant objections having been received to 1 of the proposals.

Details of the proposal and the objection received are contained in section 4 below with the Objection shown in Appendix I and Plans shown in Appendix II.

3. Consultations

Following advertisement:

- Proposals which did not attract objections will be implemented without the need to report back to Committee.
- The single proposal attracting significant objection is detailed in section 4 below.

4. Specific Proposals and Recommendations

 Fore St, Bere Alston – Appendix II, Plan No's ENV5673-009 and ENV5673-009 (Rev1)

A proposal was advertised to provide Loading and Unloading facilities adjacent to the shops and to extend the area of limited waiting available for shoppers. (Plan No. ENV5673-009). The proposals would restrict parking until 6pm Monday to Saturday.

Bere Ferrers Parish Council have asked for the proposal to be amended to allow parking after 4pm Monday to Saturday rather than 6pm. This would be a relaxation of the advertised proposal and would not need to be re-advertised. The letter from Bere Ferrers Parish Council is shown in Appendix I and the revised proposal is shown in Appendix II Plan No. ENV5673-009 (Rev1). The revision requested by the

Parish Council is based on an appreciation of local traffic conditions and is considered to be a reasonable amendment.

RECOMMENDATION – that the revised proposal shown in Appendix II Plan No. ENV5673-009 (Rev1) is implemented.

5. Financial Considerations

The total costs of the scheme are contained within a countywide budget of £100,000 which has been allocated from the On-Street Parking Account.

There is be a cost to the Council in advertising a new Traffic Order for each Committee Area, this will be approximately \pounds 1,500. In addition, the costs of any changes to signing or lining will be attributed to that Order.

6. Environmental Impact Considerations

The proposals are intended to rationalise on-street parking and improve mobility and access within the district and are designed to:

- Encourage turnover of on-street parking to benefit residents and businesses.
- Enable enforcement to be undertaken efficiently.
- Encourage longer term visitors to use off street car parks.
- Encourage commuters to make more sustainable travel choices eg Car Share, Public Transport, Walking and Cycling.
- Assist pedestrians and other vulnerable road users in crossing the highway.

The Environmental effects of the scheme are therefore positive.

7. Equality Considerations

There are not considered to be any equality issues associated with the proposals. The impact will therefore be neutral.

8. Legal Considerations

The lawful implications and consequences of the proposal have been considered and taken into account in the preparation of this report.

When making a Traffic Regulation Order it is the County Council's responsibility to ensure that all relevant legislation is complied with. This includes Section 122 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 that states that it is the duty of a local authority, so far as practicable, secures the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic and provision of parking facilities. It is considered that the proposals comply with Section 122 of the Act as they practically secure the safe and expeditious movement of traffic in the West Devon Borough.

9. Risk Management Considerations

There are thought to be no major safety issues arising from the proposals.

10. Public Health Impact

There is not considered to be any public health impact.

Proposed Restrictions Amendments Order Bere Alston IMR/B13396-5673

1 We refer to the above order in respect of the provision of a loading bay in Fore Street, Bere Alston, together with other changes. The purpose of this letter is to achieve the same limited waiting time periods from 9am to 4pm (30 minutes) for all parts of this street affected by restricted parking.

2 The Amendments Order for the provision of loading bay and additional restricted parking spaces has come about from scheme 7 of the Parish Council's Road Strategy, which was discussed with a number of Highway Officers, including Mr David Whitton who endorsed it and advised that it should be part of the Bere Peninsula Neighbourhood Plan. This advice was followed and the B.P.N.P. has now been accepted by the planning inspectorate and will complete its formal stage at a Parish Referendum to be held on 27 September, 2018 by the Electoral Office of West Devon Borough Council.

3 Bere Alston's Fore Street is the shopping area for the village and the parking capacity has been overtaken by new housing developments, with more to come. There is only one public car park which is heavily used as residential parking spaces by nearby houses; and access to Fore Street is by a long flight of steps. Therefore the aim of the Parish Council is to maximise the space for short term parking, in Fore Street, for the benefit of residents and the local shops, and have a lorry bay for the major morning deliveries from 7am to 11am.

4 The Council asked that this proposal, with the addition of restricted parking in the lorry bay area after 11am be considered by the West Devon Highways & Traffic Orders Committee, at its meeting on 16 July, 2018. At the meeting the lorry bay and the additional adjacent parking spaces were approved. However, the additional restricted parking for the lorry bay after 11am was not tabled because it was thought by Highways Officers that this might cause confusion to Enforcement Officers.

The present position is that there will be a lorry bay and no waiting from 11am 5 to 6pm, whereas the remainder of the streets restricted waiting expires at 4pm. After discussions with Senior Highways Officer Mr. Mike Jones he believes that a change could possibly be made to Agenda Item 5 of the HATOC meeting for the plan to read: **Proposed Restrictions**





Report of the Chief Officer for Highways, Infrastructure Development and Waste

Please note that the following recommendations are subject to consideration and determination by the Committee before taking effect.

Recommendation: It is recommended that:

- (a) the contents of the report are noted; and
- (b) the recommendation contained in Section 4 to this report is agreed.

1. Background

Proposals for amendments to parking restrictions in South Zeal were advertised in September and October 2017 as part of the West Devon Annual Waiting Restriction Programme. The proposals had been submitted for inclusion in the review by South Tawton Parish Council following a local consultation on parking issues within South Zeal.

A large number of responses to the advertised proposals were received and subsequently reported to the West Devon Highways and Traffic Orders Committee at its meeting on 9 November 2017. The Committee also listened to a verbal presentation objecting to the proposals at the meeting and agreed that a site meeting should take place to look at the issues in more detail and that the matter might then be brought before a future meeting of the Committee.

Following the site meeting in December 2017 a number of amendments were agreed and at the request of South Tawton Parish Council the matter was deferred to this October 2018 Committee meeting for decision.

2. Proposal

In consideration of the time that has elapsed since the December 2017 site visit and because the proposals are now amended from the original advertised proposals, it is considered appropriate that the revised proposals should be re-advertised and presented to the next available Committee meeting on 22 March 2019.

Details and plans of the revised proposals are shown in Appendices I & II to this report respectively.

3. Consultations

A letter has been received from South Tawton Parish Council giving details of an incident in September 2018 where a Fire Tender had to re-route due to cars parked on the corner of School Lane. The letter is shown as Appendix III to this report.

Proposals intended to prevent recurrence of this issue are shown in Appendix II Plan No ENV5605-010 (A) Rev1

Following advertisement:

- Proposals which do not attract objections will be implemented without the need to report back to Committee.
- Proposals attracting significant objection will be reported to this Committee at its meeting on 22 March 2019.

4. Specific Proposals and Recommendations

Dear Philip,

I'm writing on behalf of South Tawton Parish Council regarding the incident named above (log number VV019020-09092018).

The Parish Council was contacted by a parishioner on Sunday 9th September with information about a fire in South Zeal village. The parishioner stated that:

Control of the village and turn around to get up to Moons Cross to come in the back way.

Names have been redacted to retain anonymity.

On 20th September, I spoke to a representative from the Fire Service about this incident. The representative had not been involved in the incident, but had spoken to the crew who attended and confirmed the report above. Points noted by the Fire Service were:

- They were called out to a fire on Tawton Lane, and knew that historically there had been parking problems in that area.
- The small engine was used, and tried to come through the village the normal way (past the pubs on the main street and along Tawton Lane). They were unable to make the turn into Tawton Lane because of cars parked on the approach (by St Mary's Chapel) so were unable to swing out to make the turn.
- They would not have got along Tawton Lane anyway due to cars parked along the lane.
- The crew had to turn around and go back the other way to enter the lane via Moons Cross.
- The crew were not surprised because there are always cars parked on the approach and along Tawton Lane.

The Parish Council had also been told by a parishioner that the crew had mentioned that the larger fire engine would not have been able to access the lane from the other end (via Moons Cross). I asked the representative for clarification on this and he commented in an email on 24th September that:

Bill Cann, Ken Crawford, Ian Guscott, Jessica Jeffery, Ian McAvoy, Fi Reddaway, Andrew Sampson (Chairman), Jenny Shaddick, Paul Warne, Jane White

"I've spoken to the crew about whether the first appliance from Okehampton would have reached the destination and although they couldn't say for definite they didn't think that it would. Having said that the smaller appliance would be preferred to attend South Zeal as there are lots of narrow roads."

The Parish Council has asked me to write to Devon County Council and the members of West Devon HATOC regarding this incident as concerns about the access of the emergency services (the fire service in particular) was a significant factor in the Parish Council's decision to support the TRO proposal that is due to be discussed at the West Devon HATOC meeting in October. The Council is deeply concerned that the fire service has such problems accessing parts of the village, especially given that South Tawton Primary School is located on Tawton Lane. Luckily on this occasion no serious harm was caused by the fire, but it seems clear that the consequences could have been worse.

The Parish Council continues to recommend parking restrictions in this area due to serious concerns about emergency services access in South Zeal.
