Responding to feedback from the Member Wellbeing Survey

Report of the Director of Legal and Democratic Services

Please note that the following recommendations are subject to consideration and determination by the Committee before taking effect.

1) Recommendation

That the Member Development Steering Group be asked to:

(a) Review the responses and additional analysis of the Member Wellbeing Survey.

2) Background

This report is designed to provide a response to the comments and feedback provided in the 2022 Member Wellbeing Survey. The Member Wellbeing Survey ran from 1st December 2022 to 3rd January 2023 and the results were reported to the Steering Group at its meeting on the Friday 10th March 2023. Members asked Officers to look at a number of action points which are included in this document to provide feedback to Steering Group Members.

3) Responses to Members asks

The following asks/concerns were in response to Question 10 of the Member Wellbeing Survey: "What one thing could the Council do to better support you at this time?"

The responses from Members on this question included:

- Keep me informed with community projects.
- Access to rooms.
- It is not DCC that is the problem. It is the lack of funds for us to be able to do our role within the local communities and the abuse that some residents give.
- To be fair to members and for procedures to take better care of members and to see us as people.
- I would like some more support around Sharepoint, extranet, etc.
- Locality Budget there seems to be a lack of response regarding forms being processed. In my first Term we were given regular updates and I could speak to an Officer. We seem to have gone backwards.

For these points, Members were individually contacted to share their concerns and find resolutions by the Deputy Head of Democratic Services.

In response to Question 11, "Thinking ahead for the next 2 years of the Council term, what areas of training and development should we focus on for Members?"

Members suggested a range of training sessions which have been incorporated into a Forward Plan for the upcoming All Member Development Sessions.

4) Analysis of Members elected in 2021 and returning Members

At the Member Development Steering Group meeting of Friday 10th March, Members requested that Officers analyse the responses received from Members first elected in 2021 against returning Members.

Out of the 29 responses received, 8 were from Members first elected in 2021 whilst 21 responses were received from returning Members.

In summary, Members first elected in 2021 are somewhat in the middle of those returning Members. Taking questions 4 and 10 and 12a as examples, those elected in 2021 were less likely to pick the extremely positive or extremely negative answers at both sides e.g., "Very satisfied or "Not at all satisfied" or "Very confident"

Appendix 1 includes side by side graphs to compare of the results from Members first elected in 2021 and returning Members for questions 2, 3, 4, 10 and 12a.
