Annual Local Waiting Restriction Programme

Report of the Chief Officer for Highways, Infrastructure Development and Waste

Please note that the following recommendations are subject to consideration and determination by the Committee before taking effect.

Recommendation: It is recommended that:

(a) work on the annual waiting restrictions programme process for 2019/2020 is noted;

(b) the recommendations contained in Appendix II to this report are agreed.

1. Background

A list of proposals for consideration for the Exeter HATOC Annual Waiting Restriction Review for 2019 was presented to this Committee on 9 April 2019. The specific details have been agreed with the appropriate local members and HATOC Chair and the traffic order has now been advertised.

2. Proposal

The agreed proposals have now been advertised and a summary can be found in Appendix I. The council has received responses to 6 of the proposals.

Details of the objections received, and the County Council's response are shown in Appendix II to this report.

3. Consultations

Following advertisement:

- Proposals which did not attract objections will be implemented without the need to report back to Committee.
- Proposals attracting objections are detailed in Appendix II to this report. Plans of these
 proposals are included in Appendix III.

4. Financial Considerations

The total costs of the scheme are contained within a countywide budget of £100,000 which has been allocated from the On-Street Parking Account.

There will be a cost to the Council in advertising a new Traffic Order for each Committee Area, this will be approximately \pounds 1,500. In addition, the costs of any changes to signing or lining will be attributed to that Order.

5. Environmental Impact Considerations (Including Climate Change)

The proposals are intended to rationalise on-street parking and improve mobility and access within the district and are designed to:

• Encourage turnover of on street parking to benefit residents and businesses.

- Enable enforcement to be undertaken efficiently.
- Encourage longer term visitors to use off street car parks.
- Encourage commuters to make more sustainable travel choices eg Car Share, Public Transport, Walking and Cycling.
- Assist pedestrians and other vulnerable road users in crossing the highway

The Environmental effects of the scheme are therefore positive.

6. Equality Considerations

There are not considered to be any equality issues associated with the proposals. The impact will therefore be neutral.

7. Legal Considerations

The lawful implications and consequences of the proposal have been considered and taken into account in the preparation of this report.

When making a Traffic Regulation Order it is the County Council's responsibility to ensure that all relevant legislation is complied with. This includes Section 122 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 that states that it is the duty of a local authority, so far as practicable, secures the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic and provision of parking facilities. It is considered that the proposals comply with Section 122 of the Act as they practically secure the safe and expeditious movement of traffic in the Exeter area.

8. Risk Management Considerations

There are thought to be no major safety issues arising from the proposals.

9. Public Health Impact

There is not considered to be any public health impact.

10. Reasons for Recommendations

The proposals rationalise existing parking arrangements within the Exeter area by:

- Encouraging turnover of on street parking to benefit residents and businesses
- Enabling enforcement to be undertaken efficiently.
- Encouraging longer term visitors to use off street car parks.
- Encouraging those working in the town make more sustainable travel choices eg Car Share, Public Transport, Walking and Cycling.

The proposals contribute to the safe and expeditious movement of traffic in the Exeter area and therefore comply with S 122 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

Suggestions Respondent requests some paid parking on Hamlin Lane allowing Heavitree park users and local business users to pay and display to use the local facilities. Respondent appreciates this provision is available on the other side of the park but park users/local business users on the Hamlin Road side are now being heavily penalised and inconvenienced from accessing these facilities due to the residents parking introduction in 2017, and now further restrictions being put in place due to commuter parking issues.	Reason for proposal Introduce No Waiting At Any Time to prevent inappropriate and obstructive parking. Officer comments It is not possible to consider additional restrictions as part of this proposal. However, a consultation is proposed for the Hamlin Lane area later this year.

Objection Respondent questions why the residents are being penalized here when most of the problem is caused by cars from Denver Road and High Street which are left for days. Also people working in the town leave their cars for the day.	 Reason for proposal Extend existing and introduce No Waiting At Any Time to prevent inappropriate and obstructive parking. Officer comments The proposal seeks to prevent parking in areas that causes problems for accessing Denver Close. As Denver Road and High Street are busier roads it is appropriate that restrictions are in place to ensure traffic can use the roads. Therefore, it is appropriate that residents are able to park on the public highway in the side roads.

Plan ENV5711/033 Salmonpool Lane, Exeter 1 respondent – Resident of Claremont Grove, Exeter	
Comment Respondent has previously submitted a petition requesting weekday parking be allowed and feels the proposed restriction is totally inadequate. Weekday access at this location is important. Respondent does not think it is legitimate to prevent public access to a public park (River Valley Park), which is used for a wide range of recreational activities. Suggestion Low-tariff Pay and Display parking area to allow all-day access to the park on weekdays, as is currently in force on weekends.	 Reason for proposal Upgrade sections of No Waiting 8am-6pm to No Waiting At Any Time and relax some sections to No Waiting Mon-Fri 10am-4pm to provide consistent days and times of operation for restrictions in the area. Officer comments Salmonpool Lane is covered by a zonal residents parking restriction (Resident permit holders parking only past this point Mon–Fri 10am–4pm). To introduce alternative parking beyond this sign would be in conflict with this restriction. The respondent suggests erecting a zone ends sign at the entrance to the spur, but this would not be appropriate and we do not want to encourage traffic to enter residents parking zones in the hope of finding parking increasing traffic flow in the residential streets. The alternative would be to amend the zonal area to remove Salmonpool Lane, and introduce the restriction with traditional bay markings and signs. This is not something the council would consider as it would require significant signing and lining and would have a negative impact on the streetscape.
	It is understood that there is a desire to parl in the area to access the Valley Park and

Additionally, there are several well-placed car parks for those wishing to visit the Riverside Valley Park, managed by Exeter City Council.
It is therefore recommended that the restrictions are implemented as advertised so that the restrictions in the area apply for a consistent time period.
For information, the current traffic regulation order specifies the No Waiting restriction applies on all days. This is an error and should be No Waiting Mon-Fri 8am-6pm. This has caused confusion with these proposals and will be corrected. For clarity it does not affect enforcement as the Civil Enforcement Officers will enforce the restriction signed on street.

Plan ENV5711/037 Woodwater Lane junction with Quarry Park Road, Exeter 1 respondent – Resident of Quarry Park Road, Exeter			
Objection Respondent feels there should be no additional restrictive areas on Woodwater Lane: this is a 20mph zone past a primary school used by many as a short cut to town/hospital. Recent resurfacing work has all but removed the speed calming measures in place resulting in speeds past the school have recently increased. This combined with removing parking on the road which naturally slows traffic down will make the situation too dangerous for a residential area with a primary school.	 Reason for proposal Extend existing No Waiting At Any Time at junction to prevent inappropriate and obstructive parking. Officer comments The proposal is to improve visibility at the junction with Quarry Park Road. There are no changes proposed outside Woodwater Academy. 		
Suggestion Alternative speed deterrents should be introduced.

Plan ENV5711/038 Beverley Close junction with Aller Vale Close, Exeter 2 respondents – Residents of Aller Vale Close, Exeter				
Objection One respondent feels proposals will not rectify the issues in Aller Vale Close. Currently people park here from surrounding roads that have restrictions. They park on both sides of the road so residents have trouble getting out; park on pavements which is a hazard as this blocks the path. Concern that on some days emergency vehicles wouldn't be able to access the close; at school dropping off/collecting times situation is more like a car park.	Reason for proposal Introduce No Waiting At Any Time to prevent inappropriate and obstructive parking. Officer comments If vehicles park and cause an obstruction, then this is something the police have powers to deal with.			
 Support One respondent supports the proposal as there are too many cars parked on the junction, making it difficult for local residents to drive through the parked cars. Suggestions Outside number 14: reduce width of pavement, to allow space for 1 or 2 vehicles to park; or leave road wider. Attention needed: corners of number 5 and 12: vehicles are parked here making it difficult/impossible for residents to access their garages/private parking areas. Introduce No Waiting At Any Time on one side of Aller Vale Close, just above the Beverley Close junction. Introduce No Waiting At Any Time on the corners at the top of Aller Vale Close. 	It would not be appropriate to narrow the footway on the corner to create parking, as parking should not take place at a junction. It is not possible to introduce additional restrictions as part of this traffic regulation order but further restrictions can be considered as part of a future review.
