Schedule 1 Extracts - Devon Audit Partnership Joint Committee

Unless the Partnership Joint Committee otherwise agrees:-

The Councils <u>may make substitutions</u> in accordance with their own procedures where one of their members is unable to attend any meeting of the Partnership Joint Committee

Each Member representing each Council shall have <u>one vote</u> at meetings of the Partnership Joint Committee.

Any seven voting members of the Councils remaining in the Partnership shall form a quorum provided that the said seven members shall include <u>one member appointed</u> <u>from each of the Councils</u>

At present there needs to be one representative from each Partner to achieve a Quorum.

Proposed Position

It is proposed that the Partnership Agreement is modified to reflect the following.

- The Councils <u>may make substitutions</u> in accordance with their own procedures where one of their members is unable to attend any meeting of the Partnership Joint Committee.
- A quorum is achieved when a majority of Partners are represented at a committee meeting: and at least one of those present represents the Host Authority; and
- Should any Partner only have one attendee, that person will hold and cast both votes for that Partner Authority.

This would at present require a minimum of four of the Partners to be represented and would result in a minimum of eight votes being cast on any decision, action or motion.

If agreed, the Partnership Agreement would be modified for the 2024/25 Financial Year, and so take affect from the 1st of April 2024.
